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1.	<b>ALERTNESS</b>	Being keenly aware of the events taking place around me so that I can have the right responses to them.
2.	<b>ATTENTIVENESS</b>	Showing the worth of a person or task by giving my undivided concentration.
3.	<b>AVAILABILITY</b>	Making my own schedule and priorities secondary to the wishes of those I serve.
4.	<b>BENEVOLENCE</b>	Giving to others' basic needs without expectations of personal reward.
5.	<b>BOLDNESS</b>	Demonstrating the confidence and courage that doing what is right will bring ultimate victory regardless of present opposition.
6.	<b>BREADTH</b>	Having depth and broadness, in words and deeds, within the heart and mind.
7.	<b>BROTHERLINESS</b>	Exhibiting a kinship and disposition to render help because of a relationship.
8.	<b>CANDOR</b>	Speaking the truth at the time when the truth should be spoken. This is done through openness, fairness and sincerity.
